 - IX. School board voted to keep honors for 6th grade for next year in Math and ELA. So there will be Honors in those two subjects next year. The Illustrative Math program was voted in.
 - X. Switching to the new schedule. Has there been positive feedback? Nick: Yes, elective teachers have appreciated have everyday with the students. It helps with behavior to have a slightly shorter time. School psychologist agrees that it's helping with the students that he's working with. More options for reading classes. Hard part is adjusting instruction time balancing instruction and practice time.

 Question. Have we approved this? District is paying for AVID Training, so we are just approving stipends for some Teacher committees chairs. Approving about \$3,000 for stipends that are giving out at the end of the year.
 - f. Early Warning System Data (EWS) Goal to decrease Ds and Fs. 73% are on-track or at risk.

 This is very close to our 75% goal. 1st term we were above goal, we dipped in 2nd term. We are optimistic about the next two terms. GPA has improved. ODRs Office Referrals- 1.5% are off-track in regards to office referrals (off-track is 2+ office referrals). At risk 8%. This is significantly better than last year. Attribute this success to trainings, building relationships with students, PBIS. Attendance- had some issues with attendance letters, it wasn't autopopulating reports and letters. Attributes some success with house competitions and PBIS rewards. We are seeing positive trends. Looking for reward-acknowledge high achievers.
